- Roll Call
- City Folks:
  - o Charles Zanders Des Moines Parks and Rec (Recreation Superintendent)
    - Still hiring: 16-18+ for rec leaders, lifeguards, send anyone looking for a job to their website. They have over 300 roles to fill and have been canvassing a lot.

    - Pool update: <a href="mailto:still hiring lifeguards">still hiring lifeguards</a>, <a href="mailto:pool supervisors">pool supervisors</a>. They will provide the free lifeguard certification (\$200 value, good for 2 years). There is a \$200 incentive bonus for going to trainings! Will provide the swimsuits as well. Likely won't have to keep the pools shut this year, but we need to keep staffing up.
    - Drake Park SprayGround opening May 1
    - Athletics: soccer and volleyball and softball are right now
      - Soccer: 495 participants and growing (peewee: 216 [+50 than 2023])
      - Volleyball: 315 (+100 compared to 2023)
      - Softball: still open and they're doing a "draft" for teams that need people if you're just looking for a team
    - Brenton Skating Rink it got warm and mostly stayed warm, so while we exceeded our financial goal before Christmas for admissions, it has been mostly closed and now is officially closed for the season.

- Birdland construction is started: 7 tennis courts, 2 basketball courts, 4 pickleball courts + futsal <a href="https://www.dsm.city/business detail T6 R250.php">https://www.dsm.city/business detail T6 R250.php</a>
- Stone Park on the south side has the same kind of construction happening
- NBSD Updates (Neighborhood Based Service Delivery Program), Mark McKinney:
  - Stats: Down about 100 trips and down 20 arrests from last month neighborhood has been really quiet. Most arrests are traffic arrests. Calls are typically from the Kum & Go still.
  - Courtney question: small homeless camp between 26th and 27th towards the interstate, north side. Above the hill above the new drainage system. Folks are now getting in more arguments up there. There doesn't seem to be any more patrolling over there than before.
    - Zoning will come and post it since they're on city property and they have to be gone in 10 days. These folks are now getting into two of the empty houses on 27th. Mark recommended moving these people.
  - Ken question: how do you handle when there is a camp showing up in an empty rental? Esp when you've never seen the owner. They've been throwing things and breaking windows. This is around Clark and 33rd-ish.
    - They will need to prove trespassing. City can get involved.
  - Jason question: did one of the 31st and Cottage Invest DSM houses get broken into? The one on the corner?
    - Mark: looking into it, but you can check the crime map: MAP HERE
- Josh Raleigh: Zoning
  - Our neighborhood is cut in half with two people representing us in zoning. Charlie McClaren is the Blitz on Blight person, on a first name basis with the folks living in the camps.
  - He is here as of December 1st. Rental issues, vacant properties.
    - 76 cases 48 resolved since December 1st. Usually junk + debris complaints.
      - If you're tossing something big, get a sticker and call the city for a pickup. Sometimes people steal these, so write your address on them and don't put them on until the day of your pickup.
- Rev. Rob Johnson: House District 34 running as a Democrat Rev. Rob Johnson announces campaign for Iowa House District 34
  - Knocked on 300+ doors in the past month. He's noticing that it's getting harder and harder for people to show up for their family, jobs, and friends. He thanked us for showing up for this meeting and this community.
  - Announced on Feb 19th that he was running for Ako Abdul-Samad's seat (with his endorsement).
     Ako built a strong path for Rob to run for office.
  - "I'm running because I don't know if you or someone you know has ever struggled with suicide."
  - He is the one who gets the call from these families to meet with them and comfort and help them figure out their next steps.
  - Running as a Democrat, but with the exit of a voice as strong as Ako, I believe that I can stand in that spot and be a voice just as loud to advocate for this community.
  - Has been doing the gas giveaway \$28,000+ to 700+ people in our community. These 700+ people waited in line for gas. That is a big need that should be noted.

- He does not want to just win this election. Believes that if we turn out the vote in this district, that we have the capability to not only change this district, but we can change our congressional district and even our state.
- Power recognizes power. Without financial or political power, you need people power.
- Drake University Update John Smith Vice President of Advancement
  - Has served on the board in the past, is now our Drake University contact
  - March 1st: Drake made announcements that the faculty have recommended 8 majors to be eliminated. There is time for evaluation and feedback. In about a month or so the final decisions need to be made.

    - 1.1 million fewer students enrolled in college than 2 years ago, Drake is not immune.
    - Other Universities are doing the same.
